The first couple days we were content to just be there and enjoy the beauty of the place. Two of my friends came to see us there including Emily who is well educated and would like to come to AMBS to study.

Vicki helped to plant a church and works with Muslim women. We also met some of our old friends who work at the Guest House and some of the guests who came when we were there eight years ago.

One day we went with the EMM board to hear about Skyview Apartments from Aram DiGennaro. We saw the sample apartment that is set up. This is a project that is going up where the EMM staff used to live. The city said that the land was valuable and needed to be developed.

On Sunday we went to church with Nelson Okanya (President of Eastern Mennonite Missions) to Mathari North where he preached. Some of the roads were much better than they were when we lived there. But some were not! It was the rainy season so there was lots of mud. They do not have cement sidewalks! The service was very good. They had a good worship team, the children sang and gave memory verses and announcements and reports which we did not understand. Nelson preached in English. The service lasted until about 1:30 pm.

They served us lunch: ugali, rice, beef stew, mixed Kenyan vegetables, potatoes and chapatis. It was all so very good! *(continued on page 4)*
